  - (c) Critically comment on Consonant-Shift and Stress-Shift in English.
- 2. Write short notes on any *two* of the following in about 100 words each :  $5\times2=10$ 
  - (a) Archaism
  - (b) Compounding
  - (c) Closed syllable
  - (d) Back-formation
  - (e) Journalese
- 3. Answer any *one* of the following questions in about 300 words:  $10 \times 1 = 10$

  - (d) Critically evaluate Marvell's 'The Garden' as a nature poem of the Metaphysical school.
